

How to Create Groups and Assessment Groupings in Moodle

Before we start on the "How to" section of this resource, we need to establish some definitions:

Class Groups

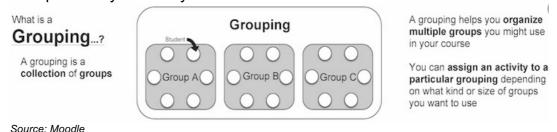
These are set up in units where there is more than one class. For example, STT500 might run three classes taught by the same or different lecturers. They will all use the same Moodle unit page but need to separate the students within it. For example: Section A - Monday 08:30 - 10:30

Student Groups

It might be that a group assessment in your unit requires the creation of student assessment groups. These are multiple groups of students set up for the purposes of completing a group assessment.

Groupings

These are used when you have both a class group and student group in your unit. The grouping is a collection of Student Groups. We can assign a Moodle activity such as the Moodle Assignment Submission link to a grouping so that we separate the Student Groups from the Class Groups. You might give the Grouping the name 'Assessment 3'. This way, you will not see the Class Groups when you mark your assessment 3.



How To

Go to "Participants on the left hand side of your unit

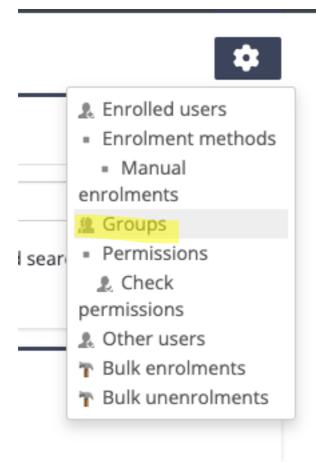


On this page, go to the cog on the top right side of the page



Click on Groups

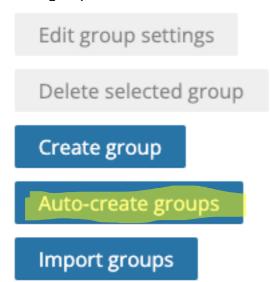




Here you have a few options:

- Manually, you can create groups by selecting the top option "Create Group"
- Auto-create Create Groups- this option is good for large classes
- Import groups if you have an Excel file of students.

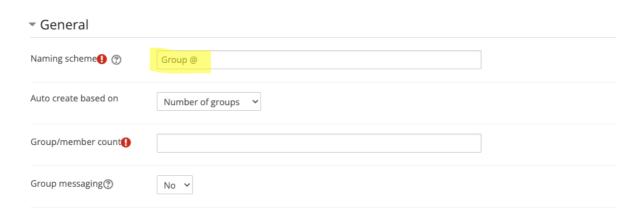
For the purpose of this resource, we will be focussing on the auto-create groups.



Once you select that option, it will take you to this page:

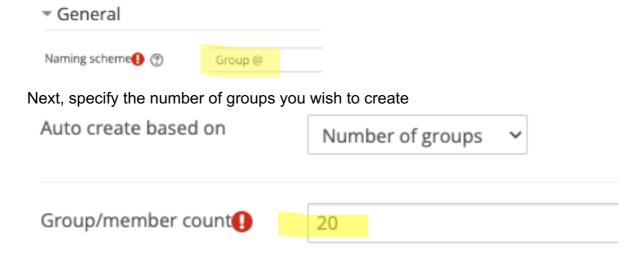


Auto-create groups

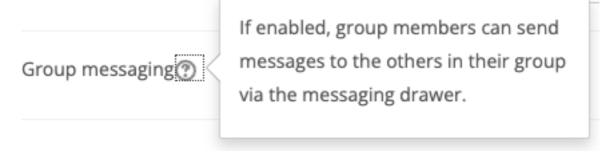


If you wish to name your groups by letter, leave the "Group @" as it is so Groups A, Group B etc.

If you wish to name your groups by number, change "Group @" to "Group #"



Select Yes, to enable student in the group to message each other.





In order students to self-select their groups later, use the below settings:

Now you will need to create a grouping that relates to a specific assessment or activity. You can name it as shown in the example below:

Grouping of auto-created groups Grouping name Example: Assessment 3 Preview Submit Cancel

You can choose to preview your groups and once you're happy, you can create select "Submit.

Now if you select the "Grouping" tab, you should see all the student groups relating to the assessment grouping.

The reason this is important is so that we don't mix "class groups" with "assessment groups".





IMPORTANT: If you later manually add any new assessment groups, you must add them to the assessment Grouping.

You can add student groups to a Grouping by clicking on the Grouping tab, then selecting the



You may then add or remove any groups from your Grouping as required as shown below.
